Other contributing factors:

- Teaming
- Communications
 - •Expectations
 - Persistence
 - School Climate



Remember

 It must be a whole school effort—from the custodian and bus driver to the teachers, counselors as well as administrators & parents all in unison with STUDENTS!

It cannot be done by a select few or in isolation...must be a TEAM effort



Simple Solutions

- Communicate expectations for students to the home and community.
 - Teachers make regular contacts (5 calls a day).
- Provide peer assistance and tutoring program with rewards for all students.
- Mandatory before and/or after school tutorials.



More Simple Solutions

- Provide meaningful staff development related to the problems of failing students.
- Implement a system of interdisciplinary teaming
- Persist longer than they resist and do whatever it takes


